Effective recycling starts with houses and other places where much of the waste is created. When waste items are collected, they are sent to a recycling unit where all the waste from each type is combined, crushed, melted and processed into new materials.

Recycling materials greatly help reduce air, land, water and soil pollution. Recycling is more energy efficient as it takes less energy to produce things from recycled materials than to produce items with raw materials.
