If I want the external environment to appreciate value, I need to do it by myself, first. In order to make the atmosphere around me green, I have to be green myself, in belief and action.

In other words, all these seemingly outward initiatives done for others are going to make my life more comfortable ultimately.

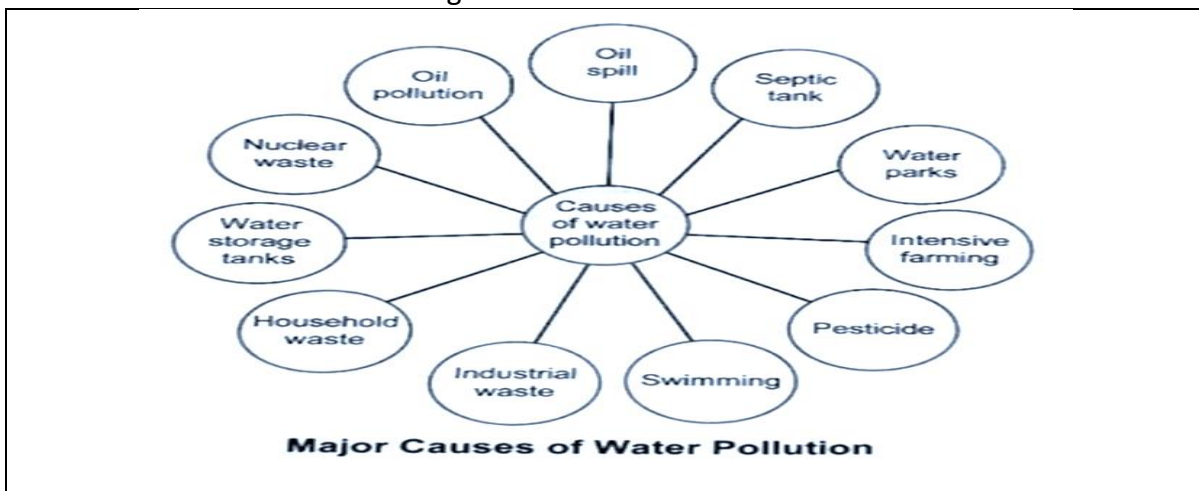

- (1) Unsafe water kills more people each year than war and all other forms of violence combined. Meanwhile, our drinkable water sources are finite: less than 1 percent of the Earth’s freshwater is actually accessible to us. Without action, the challenges will only increase by 2050, when global demand for freshwater is expected to be one-third greater than it is now.
- (2) Water is uniquely vulnerable to pollution. Known as a ‘universal solvent’, water is able to dissolve more substances than any other liquid on Earth. Water pollution is the release of substance into lakes, streams, rivers, estuaries, and oceans to the point where the substances interfere with beneficial use of the water or with the natural functioning of ecosystems. In addition to the release of substances, such as chemicals, trash or microorganisms, water pollution may also include the release of energy, in the form of radioactivity or heat, into bodies of water. The key causatives of water pollution in India are urbanization, deforestation, industrial effluents and agricultural run-offs with the use of insecticides and pesticides. The other causes are social and religious offerings in water bodies and the use of detergents and fertilizers.



- (3) Water pollution can have disastrous consequences on the ecosystem. Furthermore, toxic chemicals can travel through the food chain and get into our bodies, causing diseases and death.

(4) There is no single or simple answer to stop the water pollution crisis. However, there are many solutions to prevent water pollution, both in our daily lives and within industries. They are treatment methods, reducing plastic waste and water conservation. In addition to this, we must have water-efficient toilets, storm water management and ozone wastewater treatment.

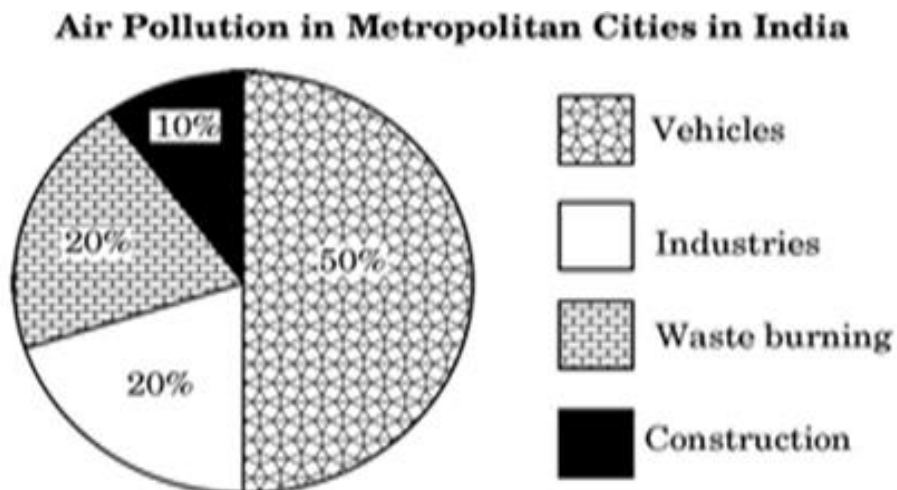
