ACADEMICS

The school follows the Remodeled Evaluation Scheme prescribed by the CBSE. (Refer to Circular No: - Acad-05/2017 dated 31st Jan., 2017 & Acad-14/2017 dated 21st March, 2017.) We have English as first language. There is a choice among Hindi, Arabic and Malayalam as second language. The other subjects are Mathematics, Science & Social Studies. Computer Science is also taught as a part of the curriculum.

EXAM REGISTRATION

- ➤ The registration of Std. IX students to the CBSE Board will start in August, 2017.
- The name and other details filled in the registration form should be the same as that of the **Passport.**
- The collection of details will begin next month. A copy of passport and passport size photos are required.
- > The details are to be filled in correctly, as no changes in the registration form will be entertained later on.
- > If there is any error in the passport please get it corrected from the Embassy before registration.

PROMOTION RULES

- ➤ It is mandatory for students to appear in both Periodic Tests and Final Exam and score a minimum of 33% marks in Internal Assessment, Final Exam and Aggregate. Grade E, i.e. below33% will not be promoted.
- > 75% Attendance is mandatory for being eligible to appear at the annual examination and for promotion.

INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

- > Inclusive Education is our primary goal towards building an inclusive society.
- ➤ Board is extending several exemptions/concessions to Spastic, visually impaired, Physically Handicapped, Dyslexic, Autistic and candidates with disabilities as defined in PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES ACT 1995.
- ▶ Please refer to Circular CBSE/COORD/112233/2016 dated 18th Feb., 2016
- > To avail the exemptions and concessions, provide a medical certificate from the required institutions. Refer to Annexure I of the circular
- > They are permitted to use a Scribe or allowed Compensatory time (Refer to Annexure I)

ATTENDANCE

- The teachers will use different tools and techniques for Internal Assessment/Periodic Assessment throughout the year, so the students are expected to be regular and prompt in their work.
- No leave of absence is granted except for valid reasons and only on prior written application by parents.
- > Application for medical leave should be accompanied by a Medical certificate.
- ➤ In case of absence for a day without prior information, submit leave letter.
- > Students should report back in school on the day of reopening of the school after the summer and winter vacations. See that they attend all tests and Exams. No re-test will be taken for any exam.
- Ensure that activities & assignments given at intervals are completed and submitted in time.

PARENT TEACHER MEET

- Attend PTMs regularly to have access to the student's progress. The schedule of PTM will be given well in advance. Please read Parent's or Guardian's role on Pg.31 of the diary.
- ➤ In case of absence on the scheduled day for any reason, come to school & meet the teacher with prior appointment between 10: 45 a.m. to 11: 00 a.m.
- Answer sheets of all exams will be shown to the parents during the PTMs.
- Take prior appointment to meet the Principal & the Vice- Principal.

UNIFORM

- > School uniform is compulsory at all times. Students who come to school for any purpose should be in proper uniform. See that the child wear the ID Card too.
- The student who comes to school in colour dress on his/her birthday should come decently dressed.
- ➤ White uniform must be worn on Tuesday.
- No jewellery should be worn to school.

IDENTITY CARD & ADMIT CARD

- Each student should wear the ID Card given at the beginning of the session daily. Please refer to Pg.30 of the diary.
- > They will also be provided with an Admit Card before exams which they have to carry during the exam days.

SAFETY, SECURITY & PARKING

- ➤ The security of students is of utmost importance.
- We request your co-operation. Please refer to Pg. 30 of the diary
- Parents are requested to abide by all traffic rules, while dropping or picking up children from the school.
- > Parking in neighbouring residential area is strictly prohibited.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Sive emphasis on text book reading and self-study.
- Encourage children to maintain the code of conduct.
- > Personal hygiene and neatness is of utmost importance.
- Students should carry the diary to school every day including examination days.
- Mobile phones and other electronic gadgets are strictly not allowed. If confiscated, it will not be returned.
