



Organizing books daily helps to take out the books that will not be used for the day and help reduce the bag weight.



Take only the **books that are required** at school. Some subjects might have more than two books, and you must be aware of what book is meant for that day.



Avoid packing unnecessary things just because the bag can hold them.

Place the heavier books closer to your back. This way, the weight will not be focused on the shoulders

This will not only help you find things easily, but also distribute the weight more evenly

### **Library Rules**

- Strict silence must be maintained in the library.
- Library period is strictly meant for reading books.
- No one can take a book from the library without having it duly entered.
- A student may borrow maximum of one book at a time.
- A book is issued for a period of 7 days starting from the date of issue. The book must be returned on the due date. If the due date happens to be a holiday the book must be returned on the next working day.
- Books can be re-issued once again if no one else requires it.
- Reference books, reserved books, new arrivals and periodicals will not be issued to anybody and shall not be taken out of the library.
- Personal books, bags and belongings are not supposed to be brought into the library.
- In case a reader loses a book he/she should replace the book. In case the book cannot be replaced; the current price of the book will be paid by the borrower.

# Leave Rules

- Students must be regular to school.
- Leave of absence is granted only for valid reasons and with the prior written application /e mail of the parents.
- In case of long leave, leave applications addressed to the class teacher should be handed over in advance to the class teacher, who in turn will submit it to the supervisor/AVP
- If any student doesn't fulfil the criteria of 75% attendance due to long absence, the student may be detained in the same class as per the CBSE rules.
- If a student is absent from school even for a day, it is imperative that the parent send a leave note addressed to the class teacher on the very next day, which will be filed for future reference. It is advised, the parent must inform the class teacher through mail on the same day. Mail should be sent from the parent's registered e mail id.


## Leave Rules

- Except for duly approved reasons, the extension of vacation is not permitted under normal circumstance. Perennial latecomers who have not intimated school authorities may run the risk of having their names struck off from the school roll.
- Applications for medical leave must always be accompanied by a medical certificate on the first day of attendance after the leave.
- A student who, for some unexplained reason has been absent for a month or more, is liable to have his or her name struck off without advance notice.
   If readmitted, he or she will have to pay all outstanding fees.

### Leave Rules

- During periodical examination and tests and other days, students must remain present in the school for the entire day. They are not allowed to go home. If unwell, students can send medical leave with certificate.
- Students are not allowed to leave the school premises without the permission of the Principal, Vice-Principal or administrator in case of emergency. The student may be allowed to leave the school only with the parents or authorized person, the parents have deputed with identity
  - A student suffering from any contagious disease should not be sent to school.



# Valuables

- ☐ Parents are advised not to allow their children to bring any valuables to school.

### Lost & Found



- ☐ Parents are requested to label (name, class & section) all the items like sweaters, lunch box and any other personal possessions.
- Do not bring items that are not needed in the school, especially valuable ones.
- ☐ If any item is missing, kindly contact the school reception at the earliest.
- ☐ Any item that is not being claimed will be donated after a month.

# Discipline

- ☐ Students are expected to be regular in attendance and academics, obedient and respectful in their behaviour and should avoid malpractices in tests and examinations.
- Students must be in time for the morning assembly.
- Late attendance will be entered in the diary.
- ☐ Students are not permitted to leave the classroom without apt and genuine reason and without out pass.

### Attitude & Behaviour

- ☐ Students are expected to maintain high standard in their general behaviour and manner of speech. Bad and improper language will not be accepted.
- ☐ English being the medium of instruction in the school, students are advised to maintain a good level of English. It is compulsory for the students to always speak in English except in classes and activities of other languages.
- ☐ They should be well-behaved, respectful to their elders, honest, truthful and are answerable to the school authorities for their conduct in and outside the school.
- ☐ Students should have deep respect and dedication to their work. Attentiveness in class and regularity in homework and assignments are of prime importance.
- ☐ Students should carry their student diaries to school every day.

### **School Uniform**

- ☐ Personal neatness and cleanliness is appreciated at all times.
- □ Nails should be clipped short and clean. Growing long nails and using nail polish are not permitted in the school.
- ☐ Short, neat haircut for boys with no fancy cuts or styles is permitted. Beard or stubble is not permitted. Girls must tie up / plait long hair.
- Both boys and girls must refrain from using unusual hair colours.
- ☐ Girls are permitted to wear small earrings.
- ☐ Caps to be worn only in the Sun.

Mobiles and other electronic gadgets are strictly not allowed. If confiscated, it will be returned only at the end of the session.



Harmful and illegal material and substances are also prohibited in school. Violation of the same will lead to immediate dismissal.





Forging a parent's signature and changing marks or entries in diary/report cards or elsewhere may warrant a disciplinary action.





Students must realize that the school property belongs to them.

Proper care of school property and things belonging to others is a mark of a well-bred and responsible student.

Student should not write, carve or scratch on the walls and furniture. Graffiti & defacing walls, desks and toilets will be dealt with immediate dismissal.

Any damage to school property will not be overlooked. The loss must be made good by the offender.

### Social Media

- Students are advised to engage in responsible behaviour in cyberspace.
- > Students engaging in irresponsible behaviour/ activity pertaining to the above would be penalized.
- Parents / guardians should monitor their ward's social media activities.

# Parental Controls to Ensure Cyber safety

#### **Internet filters**

Install Internet filters on your child's devices to block access to inappropriate websites and content.

#### **Privacy settings**

Teach your child to use privacy settings on social media platforms and other websites to limit who can see their information and posts.

#### **Time limits**

Set time limits for your child's online activities to ensure they are not spending excessive time on their devices.

#### Safe search

Enable safe search on search engines like Google to ensure that your child is not accidentally exposed to inappropriate content.

#### **Parental control software**

Install parental control software on your child's devices to monitor and control their online activity.







#### **Communication**

Have open communication with your child about their online activity and teach them about the risks associated with cyberspace

#### Be careful of what to download

some programs and apps carry malware and try to steal information. Teach children to download content from trusted sites only.

#### **Monitor online activities**

Keep an eye on your child's online activities, including the websites they visit and the apps they use educate your child about online safety teach your child about safe online behaviour.

#### Be a good role model

Set an example for your child by practicing safe online behaviour yourself. Avoid using devices during family time and show your child how you use technology responsibility



Students have already selected *Standard* or Basic Mathematics. Syllabus remains the same. Standard question paper will be of higher difficulty level.


Class XI Science and Maths will be allotted for the students who opt for standard Mathematics.


## **Important Information**
